

This table shows an estimated total of DAF charitable assets and grants from all charitable sponsors included in the *DAF Report* compared with independent (non-corporate) foundations, also called private foundations. DAF charitable assets amounted to 20 percent of those in private foundations, but the value of DAF grants in 2022 amounted to 52.3 percent of the value of grants from private foundations.
